Supporting Affordable Homeownership

Dear Legislators:

We, the undersigned, believe that homeownership should remain a viable option for individuals and families across the income spectrum in Washington State, but the data is clear that for households earning less than 80% of the area median income (AMI) – whether they live in in Richland or in Tacoma – market rate homeownership is almost totally out of reach. We must seek tools to support homeownership for low-income households, so that are they able access the well-being that comes with the stability, affordability, and long-term benefits that homeownership provides.

The lack of access to homeownership for low-income households is harmful to those current and future residents, and communities across our state. The underproduction of new homes is a primary barrier to accessing affordable/attainable homeownership, and market-based homeownership development is not able to produce homes that are affordable to low-income buyers earning less than 80% AMI.

In response we support legislative action by the 2024 Legislative Session in the four following areas:

Expanding the flexibility of sales tax based affordable housing funding sources¹ to serve households earning up to 80% AMI, and up to 100% AMI in rural areas, to encourage diverse housing production to provide opportunities for more people to access homeownership.

Extending the real estate excise tax exemption² to buyers of income-restricted homes of all ownership models.

Building more homes through public investments by exempting non-profit homeownership developments from sales tax on construction materials.

Continuing State Housing Trust Fund support to fund affordable homeownership unit development.

The 2023 Legislative Session demonstrated the commitment of members of the Legislature to meeting the magnitude the housing crisis, and we ask that the Legislature continue to advance and build upon its support for providing more opportunities for safe, secure, and affordable housing. We strongly encourage your collaboration and action.
